It was noted that a second round of applications may take place later this year.

2. **Keuka Lake Project** – STC staff is working on planning issues for Keuka Lake with municipalities around the Keuka Lake Watershed, the Keuka Lake Association, and interns from Hobart and William Smith Colleges and Cornell University. The focus is on Keuka Lake, and a number of reports and documents have been produced. The goal is to put this information into a guide that is useful for the area. 3. **Schuyler County NYSEDA Project** – STC staff, along with Schuyler County Planner, Kristin VanHorn, continues to work with several municipalities in Schuyler County to update their comprehensive plans to meet the NYSEDA Cleaner Greener requirements. The Village of Montour Falls will be conducting a survey and putting together focus groups for their comprehensive plan. The Town of Catharine and the Town of Dix are beginning to work on their zoning regulations to match their comprehensive plans. The Town of Reading is working on a survey.

1. **Cancellation of August meeting and next Board Meeting** – with no objections from board members, the August board meeting will be cancelled. The next board meeting will be on September 24, 2015 (change in regular schedule).
